ACTIVITIES WHILE ON THE UNIT WILL INCLUDE (BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO):

- Rounding with one of the critical care teams daily
- Patient monitoring/problem solving
- Investigation of medication error reports and patient/medication safety follow-up
- ADR reporting
- Drug information; literature searches; reading and contributing to team files
- Attending codes
- Quality improvement activities, audits
- Team-related projects
- Communication and interaction with pharmacists, physicians, nurses, respiratory therapists, and dietitians
- Working with 4th year Doctor of Pharmacy clerkship students
- Co-precepting Pharmacy Practice Residents and Junior Administrative Residents
- Inservices for pharmacy staff, residents, nurses and physicians
- Contributing as a member of the critical care team and nutrition support team

PROJECTS:

- Major research project will be presented at the Great Lakes Pharmacy Resident Conference, and the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin Educational Conference

- Major projects can be also be presented at the American College of Clinical Pharmacy Annual Meeting, American Society of Health System Pharmacists, the Society of Critical Care Annual Meeting, or Nutrition Week (as part of the American Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition annual meeting)
