


University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Board of Directors

- Family Medicine Adult Core Privileges: Physicians granted these privileges shall be able to care for patients with more complicated medical problems. If a diagnosis cannot be established after reasonable investigation, or if there is a serious threat to a patient's life, consultation shall be obtained. Privileges to admit, evaluate including performance of H&P, diagnose, consult and provide treatment to adult patients with general medical problems. These privileges include, but are not limited to, suturing of uncomplicated lacerations; I&D of abscess; simple skin biopsy or excision; removal of nonpenetrating corneal foreign body; uncomplicated minor closed fractures (not involving traction or major manipulation); uncomplicated dislocations; lumbar punctures; diagnostic endometrial sampling; peripheral intravenous cannulation; peripheral arterial puncture; lumbar puncture; preoperative care of surgical patients; postoperative medical care of surgical patients; and performing waived laboratory testing not requiring an instrument, including but not limited to fecal occult blood, urine dipstick, and pH by paper methods; and supervision of residents, fellows, and other persons in training.
- Family Medicine Pediatric Core Privileges: Privileges to admit, evaluate including performance of H&P, diagnose, consult and provide non-surgical treatment to pediatric patients without major complications or serious life

threatening disease. These privileges include, but are not limited to, the care of normal newborn as well as the uncomplicated premature infant equal to or greater than 36 weeks gestation; and supervision of residents, fellows, and other persons in training.

- Cardiovascular Medicine NP Core Privileges: Privileges to promote health, prevent disease, assess/evaluate including performance of H & P, diagnose, consult and manage adolescent and adult patients with cardiovascular disease in inpatient and outpatient settings in collaboration with physician members of the medical staff. These privileges also include ordering cardioversion and invasive cardiac test including but not limited to cardiac

catheterization, pericardiocentesis and respiratory therapy.

- General Internal Medicine PA Professional Privileges: Under the direction and supervision of the responsible physician(s), the PA may perform the following, including but not limited to: Attending initially a patient of any age in any setting to obtain a medical history, perform a physical examination, and record and present pertinent data concerning the patient in a manner meaningful to the supervising physician; Performing, or assisting in performing, routine diagnostic studies as appropriate for a specific practice setting; Performing routine therapeutic procedures, including, but not limited to, injections, immunizations, and the suturing and care of wounds; Instructing and counseling a patient on physical and mental health; including diet, disease, treatment and normal growth and development; Assisting the supervising physician in a hospital or facility by assisting in surgery, making patient rounds, recording patient progress notes, compiling and recording detailed narrative case summaries and accurately writing or executing orders under physician supervision; Assisting in the delivery of medical care by reviewing and monitoring treatment and therapy plans; Facilitating referrals to other appropriate community healthcare facilities, agencies and resources. These privileges also include ordering respiratory therapy.

- General PA Core Professional Privileges: Under the direction and supervision of the responsible physician(s), the PA may perform the following, including but not limited to: Attending initially a patient of any age in any setting to obtain a medical history, perform a physical examination, and record and present pertinent data concerning the patient in a manner meaningful to the supervising physician; Performing, or assisting in performing, routine diagnostic studies as appropriate for a specific practice setting; Performing routine therapeutic procedures, including, but not limited to, injections, immunizations, and the suturing and care of wounds; Instructing and counseling a patient on physical and mental health; including diet, disease, treatment and normal growth and development; Assisting the supervising physician in a hospital or facility by assisting in surgery, making patient rounds, recording patient progress notes, compiling and recording detailed narrative case summaries and accurately writing or executing orders under physician supervision; Assisting in the delivery of medical care by reviewing and monitoring treatment and therapy plans; Facilitating referrals to other appropriate community healthcare facilities, agencies and resources. These privileges also include ordering respiratory therapy.
- Orthopedic Surgery and Rehabilitation Medicine PA Core Professional Privileges: Under the direction and supervision of the responsible physician(s), the PA may perform the following, including but not limited to, history and physical; administer digital block, regional anesthesia, isolated peripheral nerve anesthesia, field infiltrations of anesthetic solutions; apply, remove, and change dressings and bandages; counsel and instruct patients, families, and caregivers as appropriate; debridement, suture, and general care for superficial wounds and minor superficial surgical procedures; direct care as specified by medical staff approved protocols; implement therapeutic intervention for specific conditions when appropriate; initiate appropriate referrals; make daily rounds on hospitalized patients; make preoperative and postoperative teaching visits with patients; order and initial interpretation of diagnostic testing and therapeutic modalities, such as routine laboratory tests; medications; hemodynamic monitoring; treatments; IV fluids and electrolytes; EMG; electrocardiogram; and radiologic examinations, including arthrogram, ultrasound, CT, MRI, and bone scan studies, etc.; order, prescribe, dispense, and administer orthosis, orthotics, braces, and other orthopedic devices as may be allowed by state legislation; perform compartment pressure measurements; perform venous punctures for blood sampling, cultures, and IV catheterization; record progress notes; dictate discharge summaries; and apply braces, casts, splints, and other orthopedic appliances.

- Assist in surgery to include, but not limited to, first assist, deep and simplified tissue closures, application of appliances, and any other action delegated by the orthopedic surgeon
- Perform diagnostic and therapeutic procedures, such as, but not limited to: aspirations and injections of joints, bursars, and cysts; closed reductions of fractures and dislocations; injections of tendons, trigger point; bone graft harvesting
- Perform minor outpatient procedures, such as, but not limited to: tendon repair; incision and drainage of

superficial abscesses; wound closure and management; needle biopsy; k-wire removal; and hardware removal.
