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




UW Organ and Tissue Donation Role

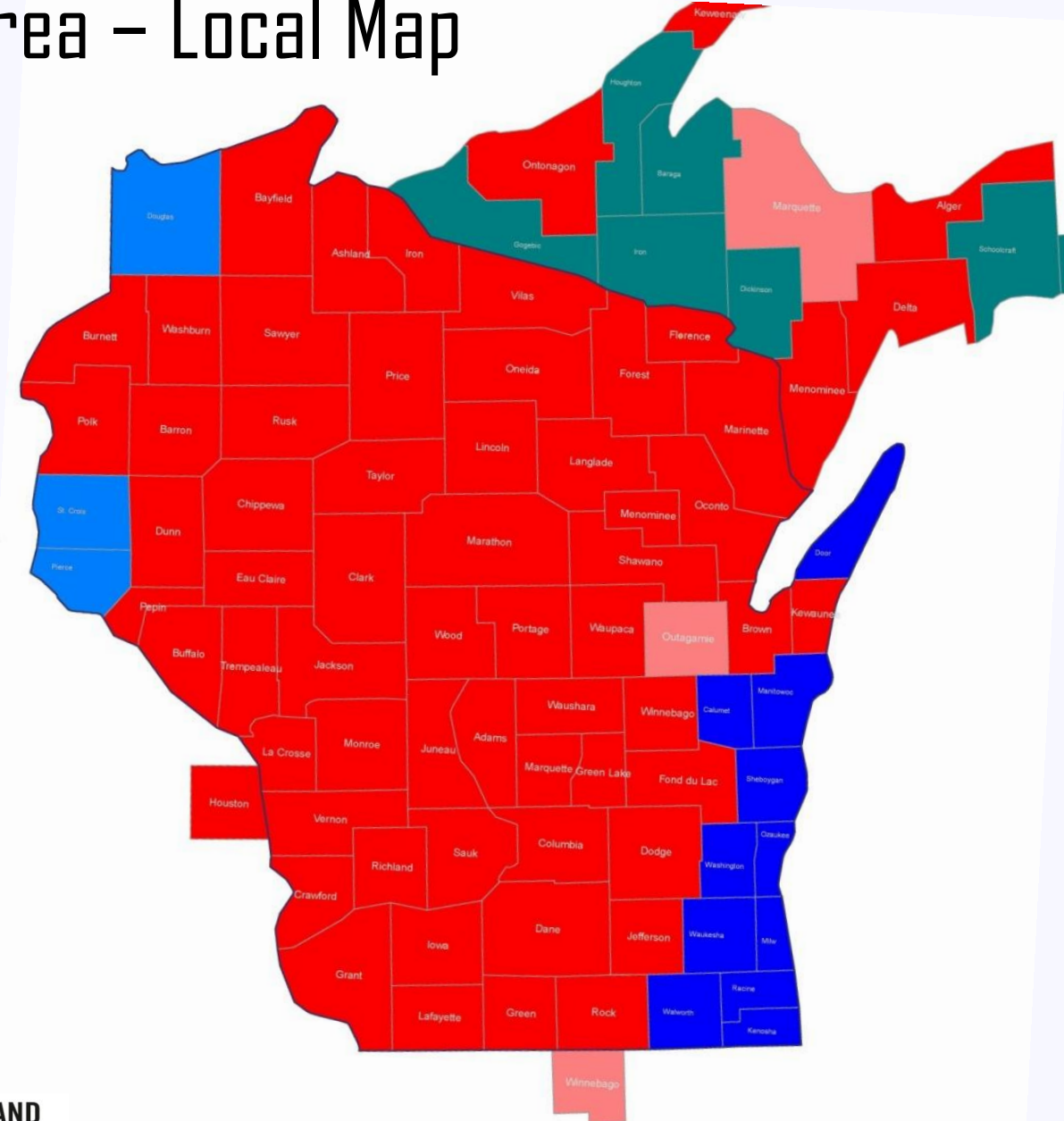
- Oversee the organ donation process
 - Consent/authorization, donor management, organ allocation, transportation, surgical recovery
 - 85% of organs recovered transplanted at UWHC
- Hospital development
 - Generate referrals from donor hospitals, educate and train healthcare professionals, monthly death chart reviews
- Public education and enrollment in first person authorization registry
- Donor family follow-up and donor family/recipient correspondence
- Data reporting & regulatory compliance
- Service coordination with tissue and eye banks

Donation Service Area – Local Map

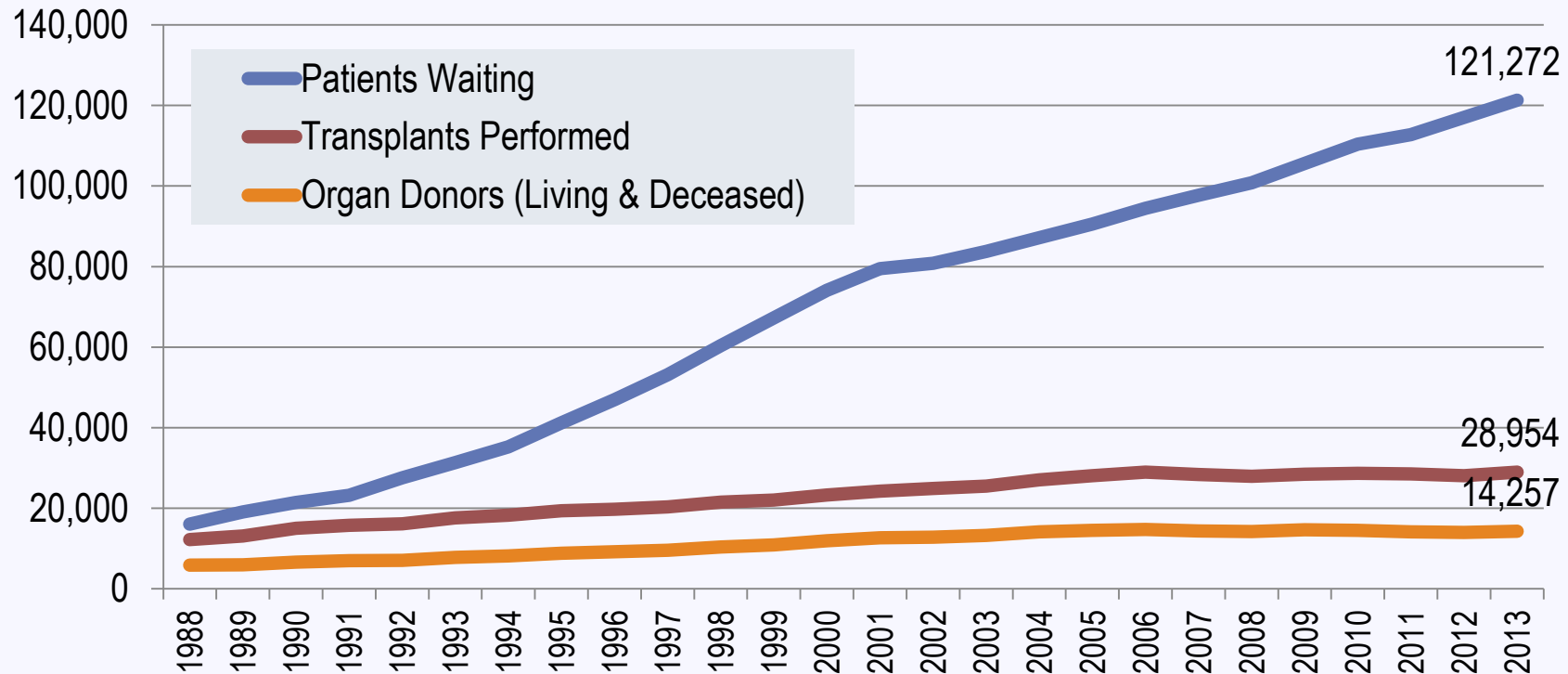

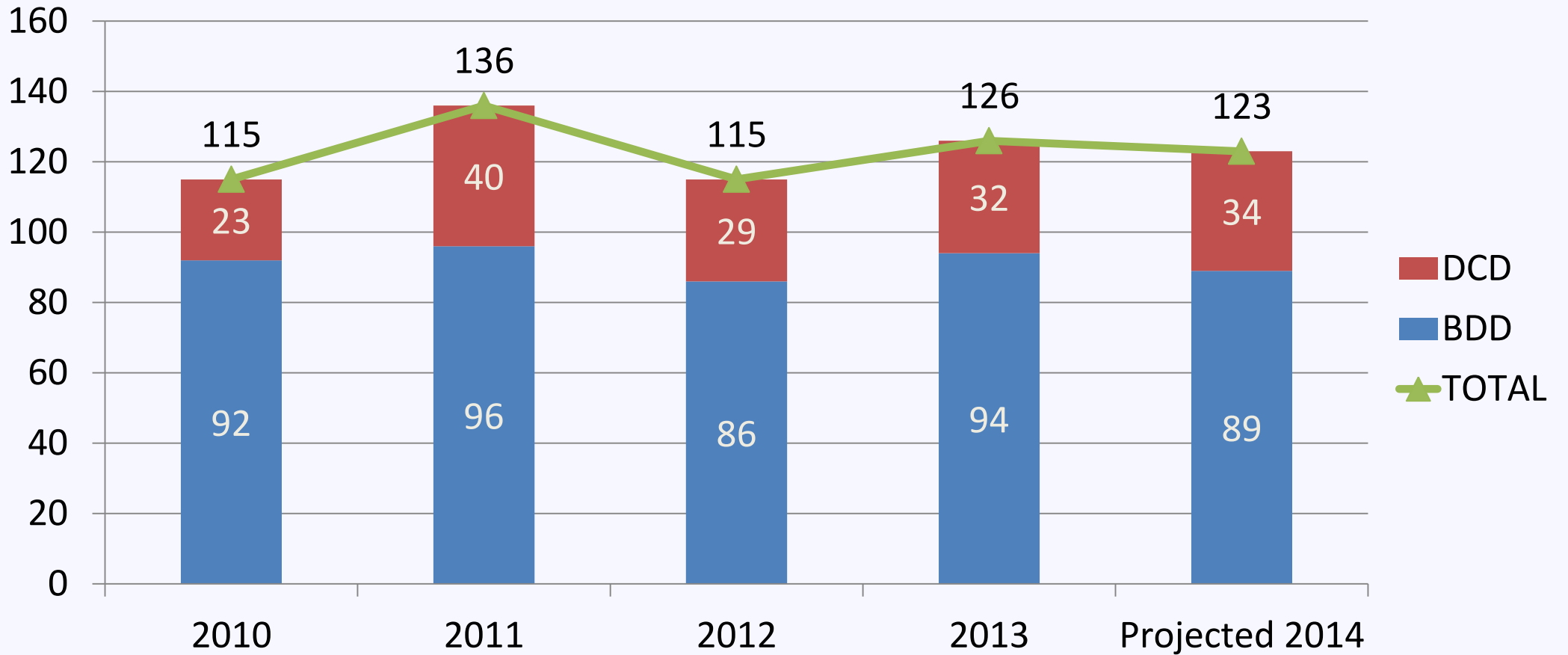
Challenges Across the Nation: Donors, Transplants and Patients Waiting

123,944 waiting list candidates as of 11/14/2014

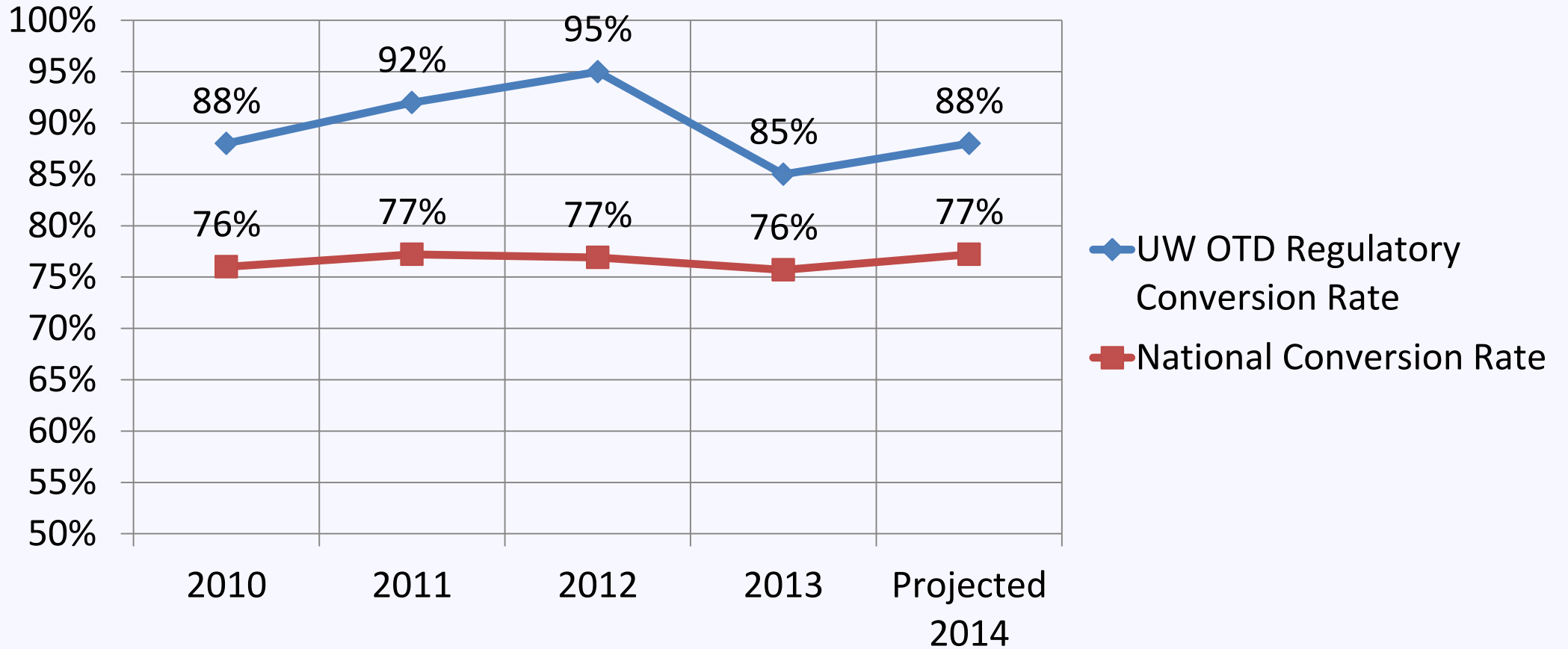

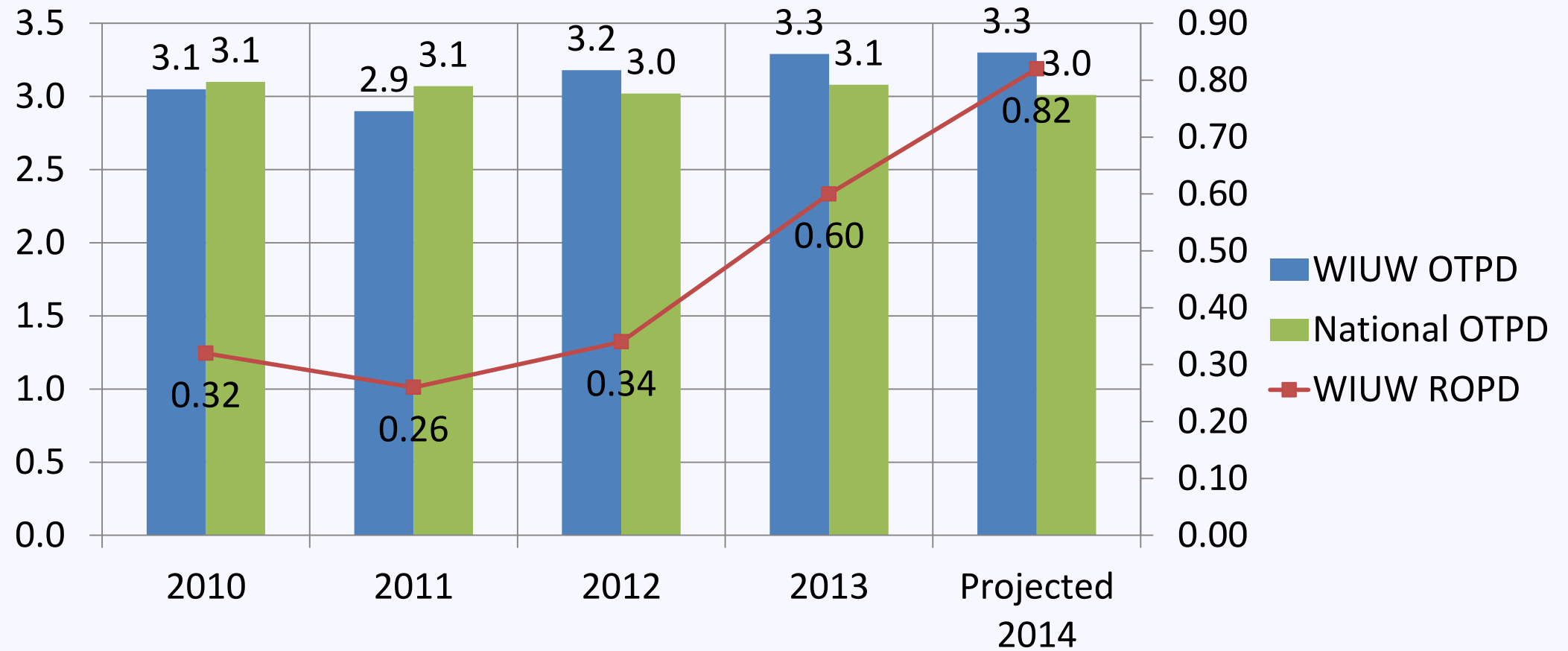
Deceased Donors



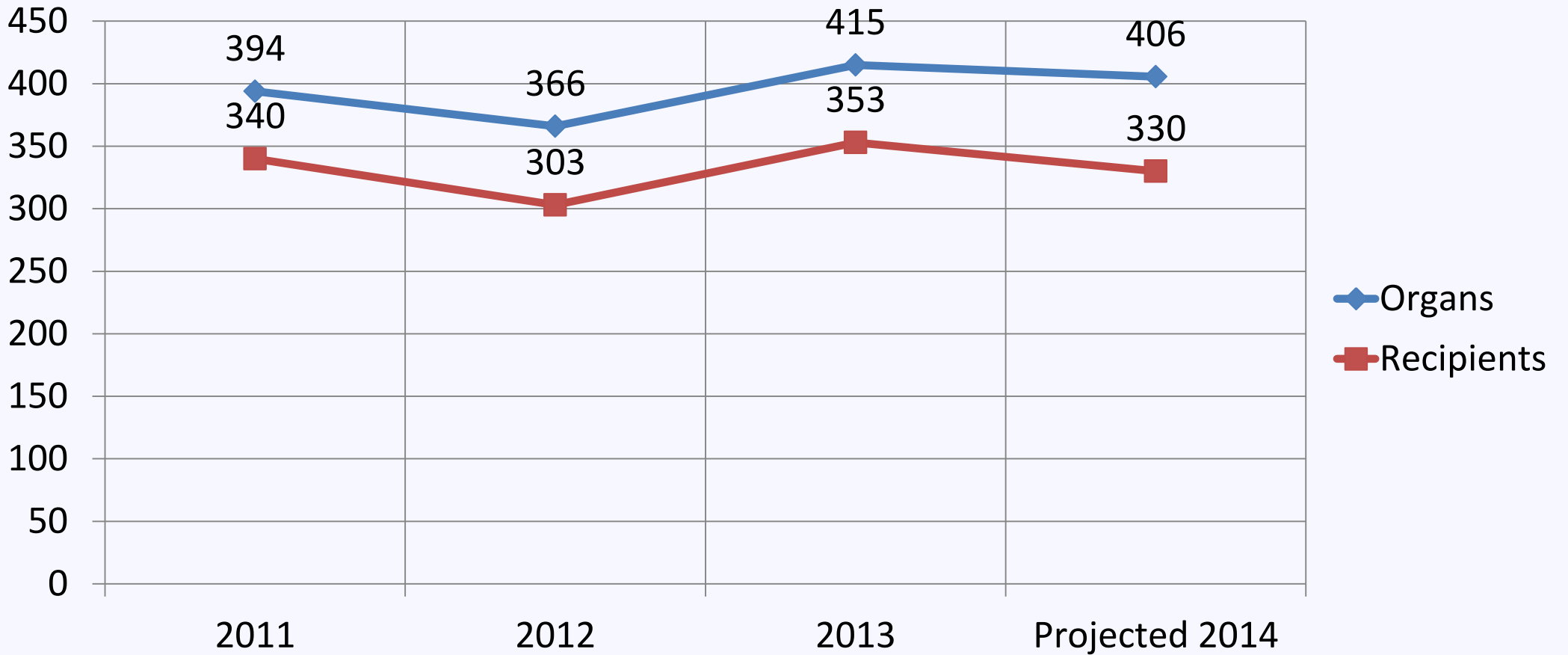

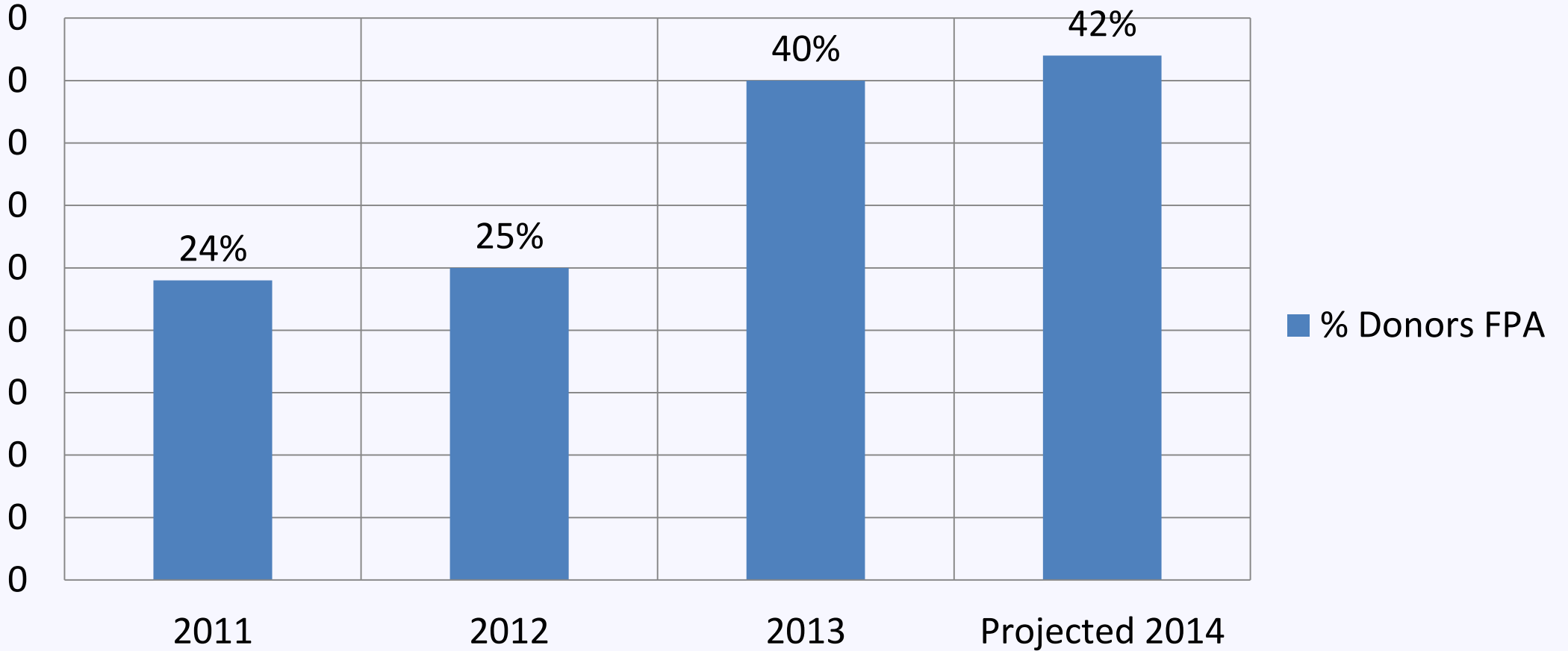
Organs Transplanted Per Donor (OTPD) and Research Organs Per Donor (ROPD)

These words were written by Henry's father and shared by the UW OTD recovery team during the moment of silence, held in the OR before the recovery began.

I am Henry Douglas Mackaman, born of Meredith Leigh and Donald Mackaman in Oakland, California, on 10 November 1991. I have lived a gentle life of music, smiles, friendship, family, and happiness. I died this week very rapidly after being attacked by bacterial spinal meningitis. I am leaving nothing behind on the table of this life other than the body you see here. Otherwise, I told my family and friends that I loved them. I learned. I read. I sang and played guitar. I saw a play of mine grow to be staged and performed. I watched World Cup soccer in Berlin, drank pilsners in Prague and loved a girl over these last months named Margaret. The parts of my body that still work are yours now. I have no needs forever. I'm past the view already and am even now with my own ones who left before me and have been waiting. While I'm also staying with my dear family and friends, from whom my leave will take their lifetimes to complete.
