


**University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Board of Directors**

**Department of Neurology/General**

- Neurology Core Privileges: Privileges to admit, evaluate including performance of H&P, diagnose, consult, and provide medical treatment to patients presenting with illnesses or injuries of the neurological system. These privileges include, but are not limited to, lumbar puncture; EEG interpretation and operative monitoring; EMG and nerve conduction studies; muscle and nerve biopsy; and performing waived laboratory testing not requiring an instrument, including but not limited to fecal occult blood, urine dipstick, and pH by paper methods; and supervision of residents, fellows and others in training.
- Neurocritical Care Core Privileges: Privileges to admit, evaluate (including H&P), diagnose, consult and provide medical treatment to patients with critical illnesses or injuries of the brain, spinal cord, nerves, vessels, and their supporting structures with associated medical problems complicating their care.

- Critical Care Core Privileges: Privileges to admit, evaluate including performance of H&P, diagnose, consult, and treat adult patients in need of critical care. These privileges include, but are not limited to, Swan Ganz catheter insertion and management; endotracheal intubation; management of mechanical ventilation; management of noninvasive ventilation; direct laryngoscopy; chest tube placement; and supervision of residents, fellows, and others in training.

#### Department of Medicine/Cardiovascular Medicine

- Cardiovascular Medicine Electrophysiology PA Core Professional Privileges: Under the direction and supervision of the responsible physician(s), the PA may perform the following, including but not limited to, cardioversions; loop recorder implants and explants; device interrogations/reprogramming; suturing; standard wound care; inject local anesthesia; first-assist on any and all electrophysiology procedures including but not limited to device implants/explants, laser lead extractions, electrophysiology studies, catheter ablations; basic electrophysiology; and assist with intra-cardiac electro-anatomical mapping
- Insertion of central venous lines and electrophysiology catheters
- Removal of central arterial or venous catheters and electrophysiology catheters
