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# Ambulatory Nurse Residency



The Ambulatory Nurse Residency Program (NRP) is a year-long program to support the transition of new graduate nurses into professional practice at UW Health Clinics. Ambulatory RNs work within an interdisciplinary team during all stages of patient care: wellness, prevention, acute/chronic illness to end-of-life. Ambulatory Nursing responsibilities include telephone triage and growing telehealth opportunities, administering medications, vaccines, treatments, medical tests, patient/family education and assuring a plan of care for high volumes of patients.

A high degree of independence and critical thinking are crucial to the role.

## Here are some of the components of the ambulatory program:

- Attend twice monthly ambulatory NRP classes with your cohort.
- Learn about resources to support your nursing practice in the ambulatory setting.
- Complete an evidence-based practice project.
- Participate in national data collection during class as part of the national NRP.
- Practice a variety of clinical skills both in the classroom as well as in clinical practice areas.

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
